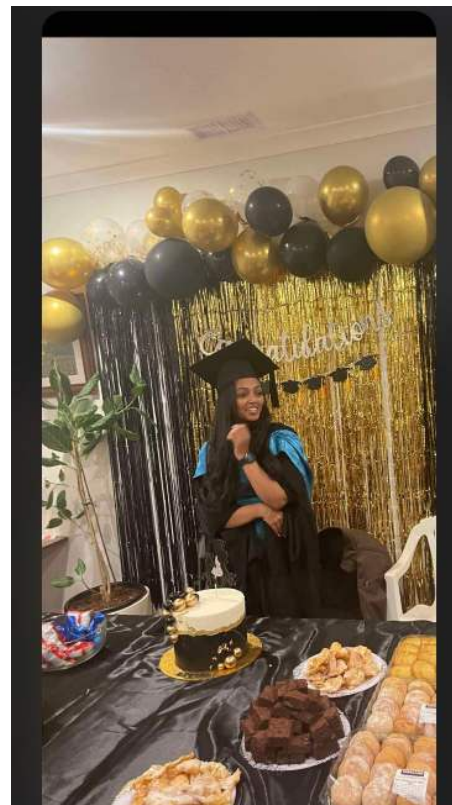
### A Word From the Executive Officer

## LES GOÛTS RÉUNIS

### MBO in Williamstown October 11, and Carlton October 13

Imagine the **Court of Louis XIV** enjoying the musical apex of the French High Baroque in the late 1600s. **Jean-Baptiste Lully**, pictured below with friends, would have been there...



But from the early 1700s, French musicians and the musical public were not impervious to the influence of Italian music that was taking Europe by storm. When François Couperin wrote a collection of chamber works that sought to meld the French and Italian styles, he coined the phrase **Les Goûts réunis**, or "the reunited tastes"

German composers like Telemann and J.S. Bach also cultivated such a "mixed taste", (*vermischter Geschmack*), and it is this glorious cross-pollination that MBO, under the expert direction of **Tim Willis**, violin and **Adam Masters**, oboe, will be delighting in, with works including **Lully's** gorgeous Chaconne from Phaeton, **Telemann's Concerto a Sei**, **Marcello's Oboe Concerto**, and **J.S. Bach's** D major Orchestra Suite and Concerto for Oboe and Violin.
