From the Executive Officer

We have had a great week this week casting our net a little further into the community and advocating for the important issues facing those in our neighbourhood.

We are incredibly grateful to Coco Cover who has put in a lot of work to assist us in putting together a submission for the current Parliamentary Inquiry into the redevelopment of Melbourne's public housing towers. She spent time at our community lunch getting feedback from local residents and put together a fantastic submission on behalf of ourselves and the Carlton Neighbourhood Learning Centre. On Wednesday I participated in a Food Security Workshop hosted by the Carlton Collaboration; a joint committee of the City of Melbourne, University of Melbourne and the Carlton Community Network. The workshop was to look at developing a strategy towards food security for Carlton for the next 5 years. I was able to present on our very own Food Security programs to provide an on-the-ground, grassroots illustration of what the landscape is in reality in Carlton which was extremely helpful for all participants. It was a great opportunity for networking and looking at potential strategies and collaboration in this much needed but severely under-resourced area.

On Wednesday we were also delighted to welcome a new volunteer cook to cook our community lunch. Ollie is a local university student who dropped in one day to see how he could help, and ended up offering to cook lunch. He organised the menu and purchased the food for lunch, and come in with his grandmother on Wednesday who lives in the retirement village at Drummond Place. It was wonderful to have this young man come in and cook up a storm on the BBQ for a beautiful outdoor meal. We hope this might become a regular arrangement.

Day is donea Lenten journey https://bit.ly/Day is Done It's the fifth Sunday in Lent Take some time to be still and notice the life around you. Take some time to be still and notice the life within you. What are some words or images that come to you in this time? You might want to share these thoughts, write or draw them, or hold them within you. Read: John 12:1-8 Can you see it? Mary, with her valuable, fragrant, poignant offering, approaching Jesus. Bending to anoint his feet as he reclines. Touching him with tenderness and wiping away the oil with her flowing hair. Lazarus, filled with the fragrance of leaning into life, close to Jesus. Martha, moving to the table with steaming plates of food, her body busy with the blessing of hospitality. Judas, reaching towards Jesus and Mary, determined to put a stop to things, to save some of the wasted wealth, for whatever reason. Jesus in the centre, receiving the offerings and blessing the anointing. Imagine you are there, amongst them. What is your posture as you approach Jesus? What do you bring in your heart and hands? Where do you find yourself in this tableau? Jesus says, '..., but you do not always have me.' Part of loving is preparing to let go of the ones we love. What has been your experience of approaching the loss of a loved one? What have you brought to them, to others? Maybe you could share some stories with those you trust. What to Give Up for Lent - part 5 of a series through Lent

Suggestions are from staff of American Jesuit magazine

Do: Turn on your phone.

If you already ignore your phone or turn the ringer off almost all the time, you're not giving up anything by doing so for Lent. So, consider picking up the phone immediately if a friend or family member calls to ask for help or just to talk. – Robert Sullivan

Anger

With the idea of becoming a better father and husband, I have tried (with varying success) to be more mindful of my temper, which has been epigenetically well-seasoned by centuries of Irish tenant farming, and to "give up" that awful dopamine rush experienced when surrendering to wrath. – Kevin Clarke (I did this once too and it changed my life! – Michael Simone, S.J.)

Ingratitude

Try to remain mindful not of the deficits in your life but of the many gifts and consolations always right before your eyes and thus often taken for granted. – Kevin Clarke

Do: Pray for other drivers on the road.

Sometimes I catch a glimpse of someone's face through a windshield, and I am struck by the multitude of lives moving in every direction on the street each day. Say a silent prayer for that person, wherever their journey takes them. – Kerry Weber

Do: Pray for a person on public transportation, too!

Pick a stranger on the subway (or your preferred means of public transportation) and say a silent prayer for them. Mine usually looks something like this: "Dear God, please let that person get to their destination safely and experience your goodness today." You'd be surprised how much easier it is to stand on a hot and crowded subway when you focus your attention on prayer, rather than the struggles of public transport. — Christine Lenahan

Missing Mass

It is hard to admit this, but I have become a bit of an irregular Mass attendee for lots of reasons, but for not a lack of faith. In *Learn to Pray*, James Martin, S.J., writes that *wanting* to be closer to God is a good first stepin your faith journey. — Lindsay Chessare

Do: Send your 2024 Christmas letter.
