On Easter, Dates and Being Ecumenical

It is important at the special time of Easter Festivals to be conscious of the fact that although we are sharing in Easter worship with a small congregation we are part of a great movement that has existed for centuries. We celebrate this year the seventeen hundred year anniversary of the Council of Nicea so important in settling many of the key doctrines of the Christian Church. Unfortunately the Christian Church has obscured its central messages by divisions that exist as between the Orthodox world, on the one hand, historically in the east and western Catholics and Protestant church in the west

This division is reflected in different calendars. The Juilian calendar of the Orthodox world and the Gregorian calendar recognized by Catholic and zProtestant churches. One of the implications of using different calendars is that so called eastern and western churches celebrate Easter on differing dates with Easter shared perhaps once in a decade. Recently Pope Francis and Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew have decried the division that is created and called for a shared Easter date. In a complex multi-cultural society such as Australia these divisions undermine the importance of our shared Christian faith.

"It has been a real privilege to receive some funding through Volunteering Victoria to be able to offer some much needed and wanted training for our fabulous volunteers over the last couple of months. he Other is an award-winning documentary filmed from 2017-2024, including post the 7 October Hamas attack and during the subsequent war. The Other focuses on Israeli and Palestinian peace-builders, anti-occupation activists, artists, academics, exfighters, bereaved parents and many more living the reality on the ground. Whether in non-violent co-resistance, peace-building, or shared community, we witness those who have only known each other through hate, bloodshed, inequality, and war, transcend beyond those narratives and belief systems.

They teach us that unlearning deep-seated conditioning is possible and that we can liberate ourselves from generational trauma, hatred and fear—no matter how ingrained and legitimate those fears are.

Among those featured are Ahmed Helou, a Gazan ex-Hamas member turned peace activist who has since lost 60 family members in Gaza.
