In Pentecost message, WCC Presidents reflect on unity in diversity

"In this year, in which all churches have shared a common Easter and therefore have the joy of celebrating a common Pentecost, we, the presidents of the World Council of Churches, greet you in the spirit of Christian love and fellowship," opens the message. "Our unity in Christ is driven, empowered and blessed by the Holy Spirit, and the experience of the living Spirit of God empowers us to go on seeking the unity that is God's gift."

In fact, this is the privilege and work of our fellowship in the World Council of Churches (WCC), the message acknowledges.

"In this remarkable ecumenical year, the WCC central committee will meet in Johannesburg, South Africa, during the week following Pentecost," reads the message. "Representatives from our diverse fellowship will gather, and will pray for the Holy Spirit to come with power and blessing upon their meeting, but also upon the world that God so loves."

"Wherever you are, and whatever the most pressing concerns of your churches, may the Holy Spirit bless you with comfort and challenge, with a voice to speak the good news and with the hope of unity," concludes the message.

Our two guest artists are our old friends, clarinetist Robin Henry and violinist Rachel Gamer, who will join us to perform Brahms' masterpiece, the Clarinet Quintet in B minor, Op.115.

We will open the concert with a string trio composed by Ernst von Dohnányi, his charming Serenade in C major, Op. 10., written 11 years after Brahms' quintet. See the All Saints' flyer below for ticket information.

Also, Sarah and Peter Adam are finally performing the cancelled recital from November last year. It has been rescheduled for Saturday July 26th, 2.30 at Church of All Nations in Carlton. All ticket sales will go towards the CAN Community Outreach Program.

Peter will open with J.S. Bach Prelude and Fugue for Organ in A minor, BWV 543, followed by Beethoven's 2nd sonata for piano and cello in G minor, Op. 5, Nr. 2, and conclude with Brahms' Sonata for cello and piano in E minor, Op. 38. You can never have too much Brahms!



Everyone is invited to join when Yoorrook Deputy Chair Commissioner Travis Lovett, Kerrupmara Gunditjmara, walks from Portland, where colonisation began, to Parliament, where we can transform the future.

Starting on Sunday 25 May on Gunditjmara Country at Portland, the Walk will finish at Parliament House on Wednesday 18 June. You can see expected dates of each leg of the walk below.

This powerful journey aims to bring everyone together to walk toward truth, celebrate the strength and resistance of Aboriginal people, and be proud to have the oldest living culture in the world as ours. For more info and to sign up for a leg click **here**.

Lord Mayor Nick Reece said, "since 2015, the community has embraced the centre as a second home, with more than two million visits and 19,000 bookings by more than 4000 local groups and organisations."


Kathleen Syme OBE was an Australian journalist, businesswoman and welfare worker who played a pivotal role in the establishment of the University of Melbourne's Women's College and the growth of the Royal Women's Hospital.



In 1972, the library building at 251 Faraday St, Carlton, became the Kathleen Syme Education Centre, a highly respected training facility for Royal Women's Hospital nurses.

It wasn't until 2015 that it was transformed into the <u>library and community hub</u> that is loved by Carlton residents today, with the legacy of Miss Syme living on despite its new purpose.

he Other is an award-winning documentary filmed from 2017-2024, including post the 7 October Hamas attack and during the subsequent war. The Other focuses on Israeli and Palestinian peace-builders. anti-occupation activists, artists, academics, ex-fighters, bereaved parents and many more living the reality on the ground. Whether in non-violent coresistance, peace-building, or shared community, we witness those who have only known each other through hate. bloodshed, inequality, and war, transcend beyond those narratives and belief systems.

They teach us that unlearning deepseated conditioning is possible and that we can liberate ourselves from generational trauma, hatred and fear—no matter how ingrained and legitimate those fears are.

Among those featured are Ahmed Helou, a Gazan ex-Hamas member turned peace activist who has since lost 60 family members in Gaza.
