Synod releases summary of its submission to Yoorrook Justice Commission

Following the conclusion of the Yoorrook Justice Commission's work and the tabling of its final report and recommendations, the Synod has released a short summary of its submission to the Commission in 2024. The submission is more than 70 pages long, plus later supplements, and this summary is intended to help people to engage with the Synod's full submission. The Synod is currently working through the implications of the recommendations as part of the Church's response to the historical and ongoing injustice faced by First Peoples

July 27 Grandparents and Elderly Day

was established by Pope Francis in 2021 to acknowledge the special role of grandparents and the elderly. It is held on the fourth Sunday in July (27th July 2025), close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. It is a way to treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation.

The theme, chosen by Pope Francis earlier this year, is **"Blessed are those who have not lost hope"**

(cf. *Sirach* 14:2), which expresses the blessedness of the elderly and indicates hope placed in the Lord as the way to a Christian and reconciled old age. In the Jubilee year, the day is intended to be an opportunity to reflect on how the presence of grandparents and the elderly can become a sign of hope in every family and church community.
