Synod releases summary of its submission to Yoorrook Justice Commission

Following the conclusion of the Yoorrook Justice Commission's work and the tabling of its final report and recommendations, the Synod has released a short summary of its submission to the Commission in 2024. The submission is more than 70 pages long, plus later supplements, and this summary is intended to help people to engage with the Synod's full submission. The Synod is currently working through the implications of the recommendations as part of the Church's response to the historical and ongoing injustice faced by First Peoples

Ray's Retirement

Those who were at worship last Sunday heard me (Ray) announce to the congregation that I will be retiring at the end of this year. I turned 69 this year and will be 70 next year (that wasn't hard to work out was it?). And while there is no set retirement age in the Uniting Church I feel it is time to turn my head to the next phase of my life.

Technically I will be on long service leave for about 3 months but my final service at Church of All Nations will be the Sunday after Christmas - December 28.

When I was in conversation with the selection committee I was asked how long I could see myself at CAN and I replied "Well I definitely can guarantee 5 years and then I will look at the situation and review my position. And having deeply pondered and prayed about this decision I am most comfortable with the decision to retire at the end of this year.

I also have 4 weeks annual leave to fit in before the end of December. I will take that in November and then return to work for the Advent/Christmas season
