Conversation Opened Between Church of All Nations and Mark the Evangelist

In a decision that could lead to greater openings for the ministry and mission of Jesus Christ in our local area the Church Councils of Mark the Evangelist and Church of All Nations have entered into a conversation regarding the possibility of a shared future. There have been two conversations so far and more are planned.

Both of the congregations are part of a Parish Mission and have similar theological cultures. They are located within 2kms of each other and for about 3 years we have been sharing a worship service twice a year and have been participating in book discussion groups.

Our Presbytery of Yarra Yarra is encouraging these sorts of conversations and there are a number of ways of "sharing a future" - such as working on congregational mission projects, combined worship services, joint study groups, sharing ministerial agents, sponsoring or supporting mission activities elsewhere, sharing resources at our own mission agencies, through to a full merger.

We have entered into the dialogue with no preconceived assumptions but are trying to be open to the calling of the Spirit. Presbytery staff, Chris Barnett and Nadine Rozario are supporting the conversations. Click here To visit the website of Mark the Evangelist. We will keep you posted on discussions.

Synod Meetings offer an opportunity to meet and reconnect with Uniting Church members from Victoria and Tasmania, to share stories and to build a wider sense of community.

Synod 2025 will commence on Saturday, August 30 with an Opening Worship service, which this year will include the installation of a new Moderator, Rev Salesi Faupula.

Opening Worship will be held at Kingswood College commencing at 10am and will be followed by morning tea. The Synod Meeting will commence at 1.30pm at nearby Box Hill Town Hall on August 30 and conclude by 4pm on Tuesday, September 2.

Garden of Peace

The 2025 Symbol is inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18. Titled "Garden of Peace," it depicts a white dove flying over a tree. The left side of the tree is barren, with roots digging into dry soil, surrounded by an arid, desolate landscape. In contrast, the right side of the tree is lush and green, standing amidst a flourishing landscape. The dove, carrying an olive branch in its beak, flies toward the right—symbolizing peace as a transition from a war-torn, overexploited land to one that is fertile, thriving, and hospitable.

Throughout the month of September, Christians across the world will celebrate the Season of Creation, an annual invitation to pray and reflect on our shared call to care for the earth – our common home and the blessed, beloved creation of God.

The Season of Creation takes place from 1 September (World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) to 4 October (Feast of St. Francis of Assisi) under the 2025 international theme, 'Peace with creation'. The symbol, 'Garden of Peace', is inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18 and envisions a war-torn, overexploited land transformed into one that is fertile and thriving.
