
LEGISLATION

Moderator, **Rev Salesi Faupula** has welcomed the introduction of legislation to the Victorian Parliament to establish a Treaty between the State Government and Victoria's First Peoples.

Salesi said a Treaty represented long overdue recognition of the right of Victoria's First Peoples to self-determination and begins to address the enduring harm of colonisation, dispossession and injustice as experienced by First Peoples.

He said a speech by First Peoples' Assembly of Victoria member, Aunty Esme Bamblett, at last week's Synod

meeting had offered a powerful reminder of why a Treaty mattered so much to indigenous Victorians.



"Treaty, though, is only the first step in acknowledging the historical and ongoing injustices suffered by Victoria's First Peoples as a result of colonisation.

"As such, at its recent meeting the Synod once again affirmed its commitment to walking together as First and Second Peoples, and to working cooperatively towards a more just future for First Peoples."
