Ayan Shirwa is the emergency relief co-ordinator at Carlton Community Services (the mission arm of our Parish Mission) but in another life volunteers for 3CR Radio hosting radio shows with a local focus. She also has a huge heart and passion for the community at the Carlton flats. Last Friday she launched a brand-new podcast Our Stories, Our Flats. The podcast shares the voices and experiences of residents from the Carlton flats – friends, volunteers and community members reflecting on life, housing, and change. Many of the participants are good friends of CAN; participants in our programs and regular visitors to the centre, ex-staff or volunteers. It will be a wonderful legacy of stories and testimonies given the uncertain future of the flats. The launch happened here in our very own drop-in space; a full house with food, laughter, delicious African coffee and stories.
