Madden House is a partnership between the Victorian Government, the City of Port Phillip and St Kilda Community Housing. When open, it will provide life-changing, permanent accommodation and 24/7 support for 26 community members who have experienced long-term rough sleeping.

The event will include a Welcome to Country, followed by the official opening.

We will continue to offer this option for those who may be uncomfortable attending in person for whatever reason - health, mobility, geography, whatever...

Generous help in providing stationary gifts to our Homework Club students. This year 75 children and young people, from prep through Year 12, have attended the club. In a climate where "youth crime" dominates headlines, our programs offer a different, faith and justice-informed response: mentoring, study support, and encouragement that address the root causes of disadvantage rather than just its symptoms.

This year we are very excited to have been able to pilot our Transition to Secondary School program, including the Study Skills group for senior students at Carlton Primary School and "The Study Lounge" at University High, supporting young people with guidance, belonging, and the skills they need to thrive. It is hoped this will provide some ongoing, consistent and relationship based support for students from Carlton PS as they transition to secondary school at University High School. We continue to offer our usual programs to students in other year levels at the Kathleen Syme Library and Carlton PS also.

As we approach the end of the year, we hope to give each student a small gift of a book and some stationery. Standing Together for Public Housing call for support, September 2025



The intent of this statement is to establish a common base for the Victorian housing sector, from tenants' associations and advocacy groups to community housing associations and the established peak bodies. In addition, the call is being made to community legal centres, residents' associations, neighbourhood houses, religious centres, unions, universities and so on. All groups agreeing to these basic principles are invited to a public meeting on Thursday 23 October, 6pm at the Capitol Theatre, 113 Swanston St. Melbourne, to discuss ways of proceeding. The authors of this statement are not an alternative group, they are just the engine behind this specific campaign.

Australia is in the worst housing crisis in its history. The effects of this are felt mainly and most severely by low and moderate-income households. The State of Victoria has the lowest level of public and community housing in Australia, at 2.8 percent. Over 58,000 households remain on the State public housing waiting list; many more remain in over-priced substandard private rental accommodation.

In this worsening situation, the State government plans to demolish Melbourne's 44 public housing towers. No evaluations of the structural conditions of the buildings have been released. Expert proposals to retrofit the towers with minimal disruption to residents have been ignored. The demolitions will displace more than 10,000 people with no relocation plans other than to be pushed to the front of the waiting list, meaning those already on the list will have to wait longer.

Meanwhile, other tracts of public land deemed surplus to government requirements are being sold to private companies for market-rate residential development. Just 10 percent of this housing is required to be 'affordable' (i.e. it will sell or rent at 90% of market price – NOT affordable to households on less than \$100K p.a.). Residential developers on private land are not required to build ANY below market-rate housing. This impoverished policy landscape in Victoria cannot be allowed to continue.

We call on the Victorian Labor government to:

- Commission and release detailed evaluations of the structural conditions of all the towers. If and when a strong case is made for demolition, build replacement public housing nearby or elsewhere on the estate first, and relocate the tenants when complete.
- End all 'surplus' public land sales and use that land to build more public housing.
- Introduce a mandatory component of public housing in new multi-unit developments on private land.

A Couple of Opportunities to Learn about the Recommendations of the Yoorrook Commission and Responses From Churches and Public Institutions

You are invited you to join a special forum to explore how the different churches might respond to the Yoorrook recommendations. Yoorrook has been a groundbreaking project in truth-telling, with many First Nations people showing courage to share their truth.

It is now over to the different denominations to decide how to respond to the truths revealed in Yoorrook.

On the day you will hear from different denominations speaking to their plans to respond, and how you can work within your church to create change.

This forum will have a special, but not exclusive, focus on recommendations 18 and 19 about land justice from the final <u>Yoorrook Report</u>.

To help assist in the conversation, distinguished Indigenous Theologian Aunty Prof Anne Pattel -Grey will be presenting, along with a panel of church representatives.

TRUTH BE TOLD: How we can respond to the Yoorook Justice Commission

This is a pivotal moment in history to respond, not react, to the remarkable report and recommendations that are being offered to us.

The online panel, hosted by Naomi Wolfe, with Aunty Janet Turpie-Johnstone and Jane Hope will bring together people of different faith traditions and practice, Aboriginal people and allies, to engage with us in broad and diverse reflections on the status quo and ways forward as individuals and as collectives within our congregations, communities, and faith traditions.

We strongly encourage all who wish to attend to read the Yoorrook for Transformation- Summary Report beforehand (Recommendations 62-69 relate to Universities, and Recommendation 19 relates to Churches). We hope that reflections and discussion might foster some proactive and generative thinking and action so we can be agents for change on these fronts.

We expect this webinar to be of particular interest to anyone who attends or holds any leadership role for a place of worship or other faith-based organisation. Also, the academic and support staff, students and alumni of any institution of theological learning.




